CADEM REPORT

PRE-ENDORSMENT CONFERENCES HELD SATURDAY FEBRUARY 12, 2022

As a delegate for the TP Dems Club I attended the online Zoom conference for the CADEM preendorsement conferences held on February 12, 2022. Here are some highlights.

- 1. There were 5 districts at issue in the pre-endorsement conference where qualified candidates had filed and been determined eligible. Qualified candidates who had received 70% or more of the eligible vote before the conference (through voting by online mail) were placed on a consent calendar to be adopted at the March 6 CADEM conference. Candidates who got 70% of the vote or more at this Feb 12 pre-endorsement conference were also placed on that consent calendar.
- 2. Those qualified candidates with more than 70% of the vote pre-conference and placed on the consent calendar before the pre-endorsement conference from our area were:
 - a. Brian Maienschen Ass. Dist. 76
 - b. Tasha Boerner Horvath—Ass. Dist. 77
 - c. Chris Ward Ass. Dist 78
 - d. Akila Weber Ass. Dist. 79
- 3. The voting results for the remaining candidates voted on at the pre-endorsement conference were as follows. Those who received 70% or more of this vote move on to the consent calendar as well. They are highlighted in yellow:

AD 71: No endorsement—3 votes

AD 72: Judie Mancuso 54 votes (98.18%)

AD 74: Chris Duncan 43 votes (79.63%)

AD 74: Laurie Girard 6 votes (11.11%)

AD 74: No endorsement 5 votes (9.26%)

SD 48: Stephen Houlihan CD 48 36 votes (94.75%)

SD 48 No endorsement 2 votes (5.26%)

SD 38: Catherine Blakespear SD 38 107 votes (98.17%)

SD 38: No endorsement 2 votes (1.83%)

SD 40: Joseph Rocha 50 votes (94.34%)

SD 40: No endorsement 3 votes (5.66%)

4. The only contested position I was eligible to vote on at the pre-endorsement conference was Ca. Senate District 38 for which there were two competing democrats: Catherine Blakespear and Joe Kerr. Catherine Blakespear got 107 votes (98.17%) and there were two "no endorsement" votes (1.83%). Catherine Blakespear qualified for the consent calendar with more than 70% of the vote.
